Kent Valley Ice Centre, Kent, WA – KVHA News for 17 November, 2010 – Zac Cadiente's impressive Shorthanded Hat Trick two weekends ago prompted me to dig through our archives to confirm that Cadiente's feat was indeed a KVHA record. During the course of exploring old score sheets and searching through archived game write-ups I discovered that shorthanded goals are a rather common occurrence for Zac Cadiente. He has scored many, perhaps more than any other KVHA player, over the years. I'm still researching those statistics and hope to confirm it soon. I also noticed that Cadiente's teammate, Neil Dhanda, assisted most of Zac's shorthanded goals. Is there a possible record there? I discovered a host of other noteworthy KVHA player and team accomplishments worth including in the KVHA Record Book. The project is now underway and it is an interesting and exciting project.

Have you ever wondered who in KVHA history scored the fastest hat trick? Or, which of our many teams over the years has scored the most goals or points in one game, two games, or in a single season? Well, you will soon be able to look it up on www.KentValleyHockey.com.

Kent Valley Mite Tornadoes Sneak by SnoKing Blue 3 to 2

Kent Valley Ice Centre, Kent, WA 13 November, 2010 – Following Saturday's game, the Kent Valley Mite Tornadoes remain tied with Seattle Jr. Admiral Red for second place in the NPSHL with 16 points each; just 2 points behind league-leading SnoKing Mite Grey (18 points.) Tornadoes' Head Coach, Steve Mertel, described Saturday's game as a great game; *"Andrew [Alonzo], our goalie, backstopped us to the win!"*

Kent Valley scored the first goal of the game just 1:43 into the opening period. Chase Pagan scored off a pass to the slot from Trevor Mertel. The Tornadoes held the one-point advantage until the halfway point in the second period when SnoKing's Liam Kilton got a shot past Alonzo to tie the game. The Tornadoes regained the lead midway into the third period when Trevor Mertel scored on a breakaway. Mertel was assisted by Mark Hanscom. SnoKing's Liam Kilton was the spoiler again with an unassisted goal that tied the game at 10:37. Less than a minute later Trevor Mertel skated down the right wing and passed the puck to Zach Johnston for a nice one-timer to regain the lead. The Tornadoes held on to the one-goal lead to win their fourth NPSHL league game.

Kent Valley Bantam Tier-II Selects Tame Wenatchee Wild

Kent Valley Ice Centre, Kent, WA 14 November, 2010 – The Wenatchee Jr. Wild Bantam Tier-II improved their performance from Saturday to Sunday. The Wild scored 3 goals in Saturday's game and 4 goals in Sunday's game. The Kent Valley Selects maintained a steady and strong course over the two games with 13 goals in each of the two games.

The Kent Valley Selects outshot the Wenatchee Wild 29 to 20 on Saturday and took advantage of an excess of Wild penalties on Sunday, including a 5-minute major penalty, to outshoot the Wild 37 to 12 in game two. Wenatchee Wild goalie Max Flynn faced the bulk of the Selects shots on Sunday turning away 22 of 32 shots in the second and third periods while his team played shorthanded for almost half of those two periods. Two goals were scored on Flynn during a 5-minute major penalty as his team played 3 on 5 for a portion of that time. Flynn didn't get a lot of help from his teammates in the penalty box.

Thirteen goals in two consecutive games falls one goal short of the Kent Valley Hockey Association record of 27 goals in two games set in 2008 by the Kent Valley PeeWee Rainiers. However, it appears that Anton Nikitin's seven goals in the Sunday game may establish a new KVHA record for most goals in a single game. The previous record was held by Dylan Gambrell who scored six goals in a game on November 30th, 2008, when his Kent Valley/West Coast PeeWee "AAA" team defeated the Seattle Jr. PeeWee "AA" Admirals team

13 to 0 at Wenatchee. Oddly enough, Gambrell now plays for the Wenatchee Bantam Tier-I Jr. Wild team.
