The two previous games by the Tornadoes were lopsided affairs as they failed to get momentum and their opponents' scored seven goals in each of the two games. However, Saturday was a different story. In a very competitive match-up, the Tornadoes demonstrated their improved skills by holding Grey to just six goals and scoring four of their own!
