Seattle Thunderbirds Take BC Division Leading Kelowna Rockets to a Shootout Tuesday Night – Injury Mars Finish

ShoWare Center, Kent, WA. November 19, 2013 – With the BC Division leading Kelowna Rockets coming to town Tuesday night I was hopeful for a strong performance by the T-Birds and a strong performance was exactly what they delivered. The two teams matched each other goal for goal through three periods of regulation play. Nobody scored in overtime, so the game went to a shootout. Kelowna won the shootout 3 to 2 in five rounds. It was a very entertaining game and well played by both teams.

The T-Birds survived a major penalty mid-way through the third period after Roberts Lipsbergs was assessed a five minute major for checking from behind at 9:39. Lipsbergs also received a game misconduct. Lipsbergs checked Kelowna’s Mitchell Wheaton behind the south goal as Wheaton was preparing to take control of the puck. Wheaton went head first into the boards and lay motionless on the ice for several minutes. Team staff and Kent Regional Fire Authority medics attended Wheaton until an aid car arrived. Wheaton was secured in a neck brace and delicately placed on a backboard for transport. The game was delayed almost 15 minutes while medics attended to Wheaton.

Wheaton was treated at Valley Medical Center. He was released later in the evening and travelled back to Kelowna with his team. He reportedly suffered a concussion and neck strain.

One hates to see injuries like Heaton’s occur. However, it is always great to see skilled medical technicians and resources respond so quickly and competently. The taxes we pay to support the Kent Regional Fire Authority are worth every last penny.

Kent Valley Ice Centre, Kent, WA.
