November 22, 2012 – It wasn't an easy decision to make back in September when the Kent Valley Squirt Tier-II Selects realized they weren't going to be able to assemble a competitive Squirt Tier-II team. Instead of forming two dominant Squirt recreation teams, Hockey Director Lorenz and Coach Mertel decided to challenge the existing Squirt Selects and form a PeeWee recreation team. Nine second-year Squirt players were combined with two first-year PeeWees and two second-year PeeWees to form the PeeWee Hurricanes. Three of the PeeWees were fresh out of Kent Valley's "Learn to Play" program.

If you take a close look at the scoring in the PeeWee Hurricanes' most recent game you will notice that all of the scoring, goals and assists belong to second year Squirts. The only exception is an assist by first year PeeWee Blake Walden. The Squirt aged players are doing very well against PeeWee aged players on the opposing teams.

Looking back on that tough decision two months ago it seems to be working much better than anyone could have expected. The Kent Valley Hurricanes are tied for second place with the Kent Valley Tornados in the NPSHL's PeeWee Division. And, the Squirt Tornados? They are doing very well also, thank you. The Squirts are a solid second place in the NPSHL League with a 6-0-0 record, second only to the Everett Squirt Grizzlies at 6-0-1.

Congratulations to Hockey Director, Danny Lorenz, Coach Steve Mertel and Assistant Coach Bob Sellers for finding a very workable and successful solution to an early season enrollment challenge and making it work. Ya done good boyz!

The Hurricanes went on to win the game 6 to 1 and outshoot the Blues 31 to 11 in the game.

Trevor Mertel scored his first of two goals just 35 seconds into the game. Mertel was assisted by Zachary Johnston. The Hurricanes' Alex Bolshakov scored two consecutive goals just a little over a minute apart early in the first period. Bolshakov's first goal at 1:14 was assisted by Isaiah Barber.
