



## **Speaking of Records; How About Wednesday Night's T-Birds Game? - 105 Shots on Goal!**

**Kent Valley Ice Centre, Kent, WA – KVHA News for 26 November, 2010** – With all the research I've been doing lately on KVHA scoring records you might say I've become record conscious. So, as the shots on goal in Wednesday night's Seattle Thunderbird's game went from 60 (26 & 34) at the end of second period to 98 (43 & 55) at the end of third period, I wondered about the possibility of a WHL record. Seattle recorded 9, 17 and 17 shots on goal in the first three periods and Tri-Cities recorded 19, 15 and 21 in the first three periods for a total of 98 between the two teams. In the 5-minute overtime period Seattle added 3 shots and Tri-Cities got 4 for a final total of 46 shots for Seattle, 59 shots for Tri-Cities and 105 shots on goal between the two teams. I quickly checked the WHL record book and could not find a record listed for Most Shots on Goal by Two Teams in One Game. However, I did discover that the Brandon Wheat Kings recorded 85 shots on goal in a game against the Regina Pats in Brandon on March 12, 1979. Brandon won 14 to 4. Now, I don't know how many shots Regina would be able to get on the Brandon net when 85 shots were taken in their own end, but I'm guessing it is quite possible that if they scored 4 goals they probably took a lot more than 4 shots. Therefore, that game in March of 1979 may have very well ended up with over 105 shots between the two teams in three periods, and there was no overtime period.

So, I guess there is nothing remarkable after all about Seattle's 46 shots and Tri-Cities' 59 shots on goal Saturday night. None the less, it was more shots on goal by two teams in one game than I can recall having ever seen. Too bad our T-Birds lost in the shootout.

### **Rosenquist and Gessner Get First Career Goals in Kent Valley Mite Tornadoes Win Over Puget Sound Mite Blue**

**Puget Sound Hockey Center, Tacoma, WA 20 November, 2010** – The Kent Valley Mite Tornadoes travelled south on I-5 to Tacoma Saturday to play the Puget Sound Tomahawks Mite Blue at Puget Sound Hockey Center. The Tornadoes took advantage of some superior play on the part of a couple of rookies and won the game by a score of 5 to 1.

The Tornadoes and Tomahawks played an even game through the first period with no scoring on either side; even the shots on goal were equal at 2 for each team. It looked like anybody's game until midway through the second period when Tornadoes' veteran Zach Johnston got Kent Valley on the score board with an unassisted goal. Almost four minutes later rookie Steven Rosenquist scored the first goal of his career to put the Tornadoes up 2 to 0. Puget Sound's Bryson Petersen scored in the closing seconds of the second period to cut the Tornadoes' lead to one goal.

Steven Rosenquist wasn't finished with his day of career milestones. With 11:35 remaining in the third period Zach Johnston set up Rosenquist for his second ever career goal. A minute and a half later Quinton Gessner, also a rookie, took advantage of the first ever career goal trend and scored his first, an unassisted goal to put the Tornadoes up 4 to 1. With just 3:56 remaining to play Zach Johnston book-ended the Tornadoes' scoring with his second goal of the game. Chase Pagan assisted Johnston's goal.

Congratulations to Steven Rosenquist and Quinton Gessner for their first career goals and to the Tornadoes for their seventh straight game without a loss. The Tornadoes are in a 3-way tie for first place in the NPSHL with SnoKing Mite Grey and Seattle Jr. Admiral Red.
