## ***KVHA Auction Set for March 20th, 2015 at Muckleshoot***

## ***USA Hockey Implements Progressive Suspension Rules***

USA Hockey recently implemented **Rule 411 – Progressive Suspension Rules** for tracking major penalties. It is each association's responsibility to track all 5 minute major penalties assessed to players within their association and suspend accordingly. If a player or coach is to be suspended according to the rules and does not serve the suspension as described, supplemental discipline will be enforced.

**\*\*\*Please note, any 5 Minute Major earned in League Play, Tournaments, or Exhibition games whether in the US or Canada count towards the Progressive Suspension Rule and need to be tracked and counted by the association.\*\*\***
