Squirt Tornados Make the Harvest Cup Final – Take 2nd Place in Tournament!

Vancouver, WA 28 November, 2010 – The Kent Valley Squirt Tornados traveled to Vancouver Washington on Thanksgiving weekend, winning 4 of 5 games and finishing in second place in the Portland Junior Hockey Association' Harvest Cup. The Tornados brought a perfect 4-0 record into the championship game before falling to Portland Jr. White in an exciting, back and forth game. Going into the final the Tornados had outscored the competition 17-3, including a thrilling 2-1 victory in the semi-final over the Eugene Jr. Generals. Tornado play in the middle was exceptionally fine. Danny Smith led all scorers with a stellar 13 goals and 3 hat tricks. Dylan Herzog added 3 goals and 2 assists in is tournament debut and Kemper Terry added a goal and 3 assists.

Nate Dunn scored his first goal of his career, and Jesper Miquel scored his first tournament goal – to make a "first goal pair" having scored the first goal of his career the week before. Jesse Everson scored his tournament career goal, on a beautiful set up from Joey Geisendorfer and Cade Kim. Aaron Dunning and Blake Britten both added assists to round out the scoring.

The defensive "four" of Oliver Carlson, Davis Fjeld, Cade Kim, and Noah Koester logged an incredible amount of ice time in the 3 days – an average of 127 minutes per player – and were stellar on the path to the final – shutting down opposing rushes again and again. Oliver also helped in the scoring, chipping in a goal and 3 assists.

Jesper Miquel and Brett Jenkins traded goaltending duties in the run to the championship game earning a combined .75 GAA in the first four games – including a Miquel shut-out in Game 1. And while taking the loss in the final game, Jenkins stopped 20 of 26 shots in the finale, many at close range and played a huge role in the semi-final victory making many acrobatic saves when the game was on the line.

The Tornados rolled through the preliminary round, before facing a tough Eugene Squirt team on Sunday morning. The two teams – a pairing of the highest scoring teams in the tournament – played a tough, disciplined attacking game and mounted many exciting rushes on the opposing net. The two goaltenders played great hockey – in general, the goaltending in the entire tournament was notable – with Jenkins making several circus stops. Tied at 1 – with just a minute to go – Dylan Herzog carried the puck out of his own zone, saw Danny Smith open at mid-ice and delivered the puck on the tape, freeing Danny for a final run on the General goaltender. Danny – arguably the MVP of the entire tournament – was able to get off a shot and slam home the rebound for the game winning goal with just :48 seconds left on the clock.

The championship game was an equally hard fought, with the lead going back and forth. Down 3-2 at the end of two, the Tornados exploded for two quick goals early in the third to take a 4-3 lead. However, Portland Jr. was able to create some chances in the Tornado zone and scored two on scrambles in front of Jenkins. With just 45 seconds left in the game – and down 5-4, the Tornados stacked the ice with their top skaters in an attempt to earn the tying marker, but the Portland Jr. fore-check was tenacious and prevented another set of last minute heroics by the Tornados.

While the team was disappointed to fall just short of 1st place, the Tornadoes great performance, explosive and tough hockey – and almost penalty free – was a fine representative of the hockey that Coaches Harry Smith, Mike Herzog, Rod Britten, and Wayne Fjeld have been developing all year. The Tornadoes were excited to bring home some new hardware for the Kent Valley display case and encourage everyone to stop by the case and see the shiny result of the great hockey they played.
