



Kent Police Sting Nets Suspects in Kent Valley Ice Centre Pro Shop Robbery.

Kent Valley Ice Centre, Kent, WA – KVHA News for 9 December, 2010 – Kent Valley's Rena Sullivan was the center of a sting operation coordinated with Kent Police Monday morning to nab a suspect in the Kent Valley Ice Centre October Pro Shop burglary. Kent Valley Ice Center was alerted late last week by KVHA member Tony Bell that someone was trying to sell several pairs of new skates (still in the box) complete with warranties on Craig's List. Sullivan checked the Craig's List advertisement and confirmed they matched the brand and model of skates stolen from the Pro Shop. After talking with Kent Police, Sullivan contacted the suspect via text message and made arrangements to meet at Kent Station to purchase the skates as a Christmas present for her son. She was joined there Monday morning by an undercover Kent Policeman posing as her boyfriend. Sullivan confirmed the purchase arrangement with the suspect and the undercover policeman called in the backup. The suspect was arrested and taken straight to the slammer.

Sullivan said she was a bit nervous about the sting, particularly when the backup police swarmed in with guns drawn. *"They even had bullet proof vests, for crying out loud!"* Sullivan said. Sullivan is now referred to as "Officer Sullivan" around Kent Valley Ice Centre. Thanks to Tony Bell for being alert and letting Kent Valley Ice Centre know what he had found on Craig's List. Kent Valley Mite Tornados Top NW Admiral Black 5 to 3

Kingsgate Ice Arena, Kirkland, WA 4 December, 2010 – Kent Valley’s Mite Tornados sustained their hold on first place in the NPSHL with Saturday’s 5 to 3 win over the Seattle Junior NW Admiral Black. Kent Valley’s NPSHL record is now 6-0-2 (22 points) while the Admiral Black fell to 8th place with a record of 3-5-0 (14 points.)

Kent Valley’s Trevor Mertel scored the Tornados’ first goal early in the first period to give the Tornados an early lead. Seattle Jr.’s Miles Berg scored a tying goal late in the first and a go-ahead goal early in the second to put Black up by one goal. The one goal lead was Blacks last lead of the game. Ty Herring tied the game for the Tornados at 12:14 of the second period. Trevor Mertel and Jackson Grande combined for a goal at 13:06 to gain back the lead for the Tornados. Jackson Grande got what turned out to be the game winning goal for the Tornados at 7:56 of the third period with an assist from Zach Johnston. Seattle Jr.’s Miles Berg completed his Hat Trick at 11:11 to put Black within one goal of the Tornados. Chase Pagan scored the insurance goal for the Tornados at 11:27 with an assist from Zach Johnston. The Tornados held on for a 5 to 3 win.

Next up for the Tornados is a league game against the fourth place Seattle Jr. Blades. The Blades sport a NPSHL record of 6-2-0 and 20 points.

Kent Valley Squirt Tornadoes (5) Everett Kodiaks (2)

Comcast Community Ice Rink, Everett, WA 4 December, 2010 – The Kent Valley Tornadoes beat the Everett Kodiaks 5-2 in a showdown between 2 unbeaten teams in the NPSHL Squirt Division. The Tornadoes were led by Danny Smith on offense and game day Captain Cade Kim on defense. Jesper Miquel backstopped the Tornadoes for his 4th victory of the year. The Tornadoes are now 8-0, perfect through the first half of the season, and have earned all of their sportsmanship points to sit atop the standings with 24 points.

Danny Smith got the game going quickly for the Tornadoes scoring just one minute into the game. After winning the opening face-off, the Tornadoes were able to gain the zone and put immediate pressure on the Kodiak net. After cycling down low with the puck, Smith was able to center to Brett Jenkins who was able to keep the play alive, and get the puck back to Smith for the goal. The Kodiaks – a fine skating team – mounted several attacks during the period, but the Tornadoes defense – led by the classy play of Cade Kim – consistently thwarted the drives. Jesper Miquel made several strong saves in the first to get his rhythm going and was clearly seeing the puck well.

The second period was action from start to finish. Everett came out flying and were able to score two quickly to knot the score – and for several minutes appeared to take the momentum from the Tornadoes. Play was a bit chippy as each team probed for a weakness in the others' defense – and it was the Tornadoes who found the gap. With just under 3 minutes to play a Tornado attack appeared to get gummed up at the left circle, but Oliver Carlson was able to find an open Danny Smith in the slot for an easy one timer.

Dylan Herzog struck gold just 40 seconds later letting a 40 foot shot fly from just inside the blue line which found its way through a sea of legs and into the back of the net. With the Kodiaks trying to catch their breath and regain their focus, Danny Smith (again!) scored with just 10 seconds left in the period to put the Tornadoes up 5-2.

The third period saw exciting play – but was scoreless.

The Tornadoes have now scored 55 goals in 8 games while only conceding 7. They next play on Saturday, December 11th at home versus the PSAHA Tomahawks.
