Bruce Hamilton, owner of the Rockets, was aware that I had public address announcing experience with the Seattle Breakers and Thunderbirds. I showed up at work one morning and my secretary congratulated me on my new assignment with the Rockets. I was in total disbelief until she showed me the Tacoma News Tribune article. I was stunned to say the least! Now, I consider myself a fairly good PA announcer, very official and stoic. Jeff, on the other hand, was an exciting announcer that controlled the crowd's enthusiasm, brought them to their feet, inspired them and got them going. My announcing was very dry and official. I would have been good at giving directions at the local airport. I ended up announcing the game that night and another game two nights later. I was so disliked by the fans that Hamilton caved in to Randall's demands and hired him back. I've always felt that I was instrumental in advancing Jeff's career...

mercy against the KVHA Tornados. The Eagles scored 3 unanswered goals in the first period, but then took a break during the second period to provide the Tornados time to catch-up. However, there simply wasn't sufficient time left for the Tornados to mount a significant attack. Even though they did score a couple of goals in the last period, they eventually lost the contest 2 to 8. Yet as each week passes, much improvement overall can be seen in our boys as their skills in positional play continue to grow.

In a very competitive match-up, the Tornados showed their formidable skills against a tough Eagles team. Tornados goalie Quinton Gessner (#10) stopped 8 of 11 Eagles' shots - a respectable 73% save rate. Unfortunately, the Tornados were unable to take advantage and the Eagles owned the 1st period by scoring 3 unanswered goals.

The Outlaws won the battle by narrow margin of 2 to 0. It was the second meeting of the season for the two teams. The Outlaws won the October 9<sup>th</sup> meeting, the first league game of the season for both teams, by a score of 3 to 0.
