Top Pacific District PeeWee Teams Face-off in Prime Time Showcase

The Kent Valley Rainiers will host the LA Selects on Friday, December 11 at 7:20 PM at Kent Valley Ice Centre. The Rainiers and Selects are the top two ranked teams in the Pacific District and are both nationally ranked in the Top 25. The LA Selects have a rich tradition of championship hockey having won the PeeWee Tier 1 National Championship in 2008 and placing 4th in 2009. This will be the Selects first regular season visit to the Pacific Northwest.

The home-town Rainiers have achieved the highest Tier 1 national ranking ever for a Pacific Northwest team (#14) and are looking to continue their successful season against the Selects. In only their third year, the Rainiers have put Pacific Northwest hockey back on the map and are poised for a strong showing against their Pacific District rivals. The matchup on Friday night will be a preview of the Pacific District tournament held in March in San Jose, CA which will send the top team onto the USA Hockey National Championships.

The Rainiers are looking to pack the stands for this prime time showcase to cheer on the home team. Kent Valley Ice Centre is offering 50% off all beer and wine during the game. Mike Payne, Boys Hockey Head Coach, Fountain Valley School of Colorado to Speak at KVIC Next Monday Evening, December 14th, 2009.

Kent Valley members will have an opportunity next Monday evening to visit with Mike Payne, Boys Hockey Head Coach, from Fountain Valley School of Colorado. Mike will talk about the "prep school" experience for young hockey players seeking to play at the next level of hockey. He will also discuss Fountain Valley School's hockey and academic programs.

If, as a parent, you've ever wondered about the potential of prep school hockey for your hockey player, this is your opportunity to get answers to the questions you've always

wanted to ask. We expect Mike Payne to arrive at Kent Valley Ice Centre around 6:00pm Monday evening. We will gather in one of the banquet rooms shortly thereafter to hear his presentation. Bantam and Midget rec teams, Squirt, PeeWee, Bantam and Midget Tier-II teams will all be practicing at Kent Valley Ice Centre during Payne's visit Monday evening. Payne's visit couldn't be more timely and convenient for Kent Valley members. We also encourage parents from any of our other Kent Valley teams to drop by and hear Mike Payne's presentation.

Fountain Valley School of Colorado is a boarding and day school for grades 9-12 with excellent programs in academics, arts, athletics and student life. Last year, FVS re-established a boys' hockey program. They competed in two capacities: one, as a Colorado High School team and two, as an independent Midget AA U18 team. This year the team aims to compete for a state high school championship in Colorado and, as a club team, will compete in two tournaments and several exhibition games. The team just completed a nine-day Thanksgiving week tour of the Czech Republic where they engaged in intensive on-ice and dry-land training and played against some top competition. Next season, the team is looking to compete against top high school and Midget AAA competition in the Rocky Mountain Region and to compete in one-to-two prep school tournaments in the Northeast. The program goal is to eventually play at the Midget AAA U18 level and play against some of the top prep schools in the United States and Canada.

As a former student and hockey player at Culver Military Academy (Culver, IN) and a former teacher and coach at Northwood School (Lake Placid, NY), Head Coach Mike Payne is excited to build a program that can combine the academic and student-life opportunities of an independent school with the athletic opportunities of a top-level hockey program. As hockey has grown in popularity around the country, many families are looking to explore various opportunities for their children. Fountain Valley School of Colorado is filling an important niche by providing a prep-school hockey opportunity in the Western U.S.

Kent Valley Mite Tornadoes Top Tomahawks in Tacoma 9-0

Puget Sound Hockey Center, Tacoma, WA 6 December, 2009 – The Kent Valley Mite Tornadoes visited the Puget Sound Hockey Arena and defeated the PSAHA Mite Tomahawks 9-0. The Tornadoes used a balance scoring attack – dominating both time of possession and shots on goal – and a suffocating defensive effort, limiting the Tomahawks to a single shot on the Kent Valley goal tender Brett Jenkins. The Tornadoes earned 2 points for the victory and have now earned a sportsmanship point in each of their games.

Danny Smith led the Tornadoes with a hat trick, Jake Sordahl and Oliver Carlson both netted two, and Andrew Alonzo and Kemper Terry scored one. Andrew and Trevor Mertel were credited with assists to round out the Tornado scoring.

The Tornadoes got off to a quick start – thanks to Danny Smith scoring at the :20 second mark – but the Tomahawk defense played a very tight game and goaltender Joe Bullock did a nice job of keeping the Tornadoes at bay until the 13:55 when Trevor Mertel found Danny Smith open and Danny netted his second of the game to put the score at 2-0. In this rematch of a game played earlier this season, the Tomahawks appeared to have moved their better skaters to the defensive line for this game, preferring to play a counter attack game and keep the Tornadoes from building a big lead early in the game. It proved somewhat effective as the first period ended 2-0.

Jake Sordahl got the second period off to a great start for the Tornadoes – slapping the opening face-off into the Tomahawk zone, skating hard to gain possession and using a nifty backhand to find the net just 10 seconds into the period. The second period was much like the first, as again, the Tomahawk defense rallied around their goalie to make it tough going for the Tornadoes. Andrew Alonzo found some open ice but was stoned on a break-away by Bullock in goal at the 7 minute mark. Undeterred, Andrew again found another opportunity coming down the right side, held on to the puck a bit longer and was able to lift a rising wrist shot over the glove of the Tomahawk goaltender to take the score to 4-0 at the end of two.

The defensive work of the Tomahawks fell apart in the third as the Tornadoes found more open ice and were able to make more uncontested rushes at the goaltender. 9 shots were taken with 5 finding the twine. Danny completed his hat trick in the third and he, Kemper Terry and Oliver Carlson scored 3 goals in a span of 31 seconds in the 10th minute of the third period.

Brett Jenkins earned his second shut-out of the season. Brett's goals against average for the season dropped to 2.10 – lowest in the NPSHL mite division. The Tornadoes also lead the NPSHL with 83 goals, averaging 10.40 a game!

The Tornadoes next game is this Saturday against the Seattle Junior Hockey Association Eagles at Kent Valley Ice Centre.
