The Kent Valley Spartans were minus seven players from their roster as goalie Eric Shaver was out ill, five players were at the Selects Camp in Tri-Cities and another player was out with an injury. With only 1 goalie and 10 players, the Kent Valley Spartans took on a full contingent of 17 Seattle Jr. players.

The first two periods of Saturday's game belonged to the Kent Valley Spartans. Thomas Carey scored early at 1:29 with an assist from Danny Hosmer. Patrick Rojan tapped in a rebound off a Thomas Carey shot near the end of the first period to put the Spartans up 2 to nothing. Justin Sellers scored unassisted at 4:49 of the second period to give the Spartans a 3 to nothing lead. The Seattle Jr. Eagles took command of the game in the 3rd period and scored 3 unanswered goals. The Eagles' tying goal came with just 2 seconds remaining in the game.
