Kent, WA December 1, 2007 – The Kent Valley Mite Hurricanes got off to an exciting start Saturday by scoring the first goal of the game. Conner Pitlick scored an unassisted goal at the 5:20 mark of the first period. The Hurricanes survived a SnoKing power play during the first period and enjoyed a 1 goal lead at the end of the period. SnoKing's Eric Possa owned the second period with a "Hat Trick" and an assist on one other goal for four unanswered SnoKing tallies in the period. The Hurricanes' Jonathan Langmack initiated a comeback at 2:13 of the third period with an unassisted goal. Langmack's goal was the only goal scored by either team in the final period. Cole Best scored the lead-off goal, also the first goal of his career, in the game against Tacoma Blue. Best's goal at 1:07 of the first period was assisted by Anthony Alonzo and Mike Thomas. Anthony Alonzo scored the Lightning's game-winning goal at 2:25 into the 2nd period with assists from Mike Thomas and Cole Best. Mike Thomas wrapped up the Lightning win with a goal at 2:41 of the 3rd period with assists from J.J. Blondin and Jake Sordahl. The Puget Sound Tomahawks finally got on the score board at 3:59 of the third period with an unassisted goal by John Nauman.

The Lightning mounted a heavy attack in this game out shooting the Tomahawks 20 to 4. Kent, WA December 2, 2007 – The Kent Valley Selects won a close game on Saturday when they defeated the Seattle Jr. Admirals Red by a score of 4 to 3. The Selects gave the Red team five power-play opportunities in Saturday's game. Red was only able to capitalize on one of those opportunities. Landon Bevier scored the Selects' first goal with help from Matt Dorsey and Zachery Houck at 11:43 of the first period. Anton Nikitin score an unassisted goal at 4:14 of the second.
